4. In verse 12 some translations say the we have an obligation to not to the flesh because it will lead to death, in Greek it uses the word for "debtor" making reference that we aren't in debt to the flesh. As a result of this we are told to not live according to the flesh; if you examine yourself where do you struggle with living according to the flesh, and therefore against God's Spirit? (Use Galatians 5:13-26 for reference if you'd like)
5. Verses 15-17 make reference to us being children of God and co-heirs with Christ; this makes reference to us having God's love poured out to us and us sharing in the reward Christ has gained. This also should mean that we behave as such which should put more responsibility on us; what're some of the responsibilities that a child or a co-heir should have and how that applies for our lives?
